4.5 Computer, Internet access, training to teachers and students and any other programme for technology up gradation (Networking, e-Governance etc.)

The Institution provides internet facility to students and faculty in the Browsing centre, some of the Major Science departments. Besides there is a full fledged Computer Application Department, where the laboratories are used by the UGC Network Resource Centre to impart various trainings to the students and the faculty. The institution has provided the facility of EDUSAT to the students for online learning. Besides the students are provided vedio lectures by the faculty and the invited guest speakers. The UGC Network Resource Centre financed by the UGC started in the college in the year 2011, with an internet connection ,reprographic facility . The centre created an awareness among staff and students about the use of information and communication technology in various activities like administration, finance, examination and research. which trains the students and give soft skill development training to the faculty.

With Satellite Interactive Terminal (SIT) in this College having Transnet software the students periodically attend lectures delivered through state and National hubs at Srinagar and CEC New Delhi respectively. The students interact via video or text mode with the subject expert.

5. Student Support and Progression

Once admitted in the College, the students are taken care and provided with many facilities necessary for their health and physical development and recreation. The facilities include outdoor and indoor games, local tours and picnic; all India tour, cultural activities, audio-visual facilities, etc. The deserving students are also providing scholarships and financial aids, for which applications are inviting from students, scrutinized by scholarship / financial aid committee and deserving students short-listed. The College also facilitates the scholarship schemes offered by social Welfare Department, by completing the documentation facilities in the College. The College used to get feedback from students in the form of frank discussions of students with heads of respective departments. However from the current academic session the feedback has been collected on proforma prepared by IQAC/NAAC Committee.

The College provides counselling to students for their placement and better job opportunities. A placement/carrier counselling committee constantly interacts with students providing them useful information about various job opportunities. The placement cell of the College is the hub of such activities where students find relevant literature and can also browse the Internet for various jobs. The scope of the placement cell is being broadened and preparing students for various competitive examinations like NET, TOEFL, GATE, IAS and KAS is on anvil. The College also provides remedial Coaching in the winter vacations to final year students, in order to prepare them for competitive exams such as civil services and Post graduation entrance exams conducted by various universities. The remedial classes are conducted by the faculty members of College as well as special classes are arranged from resource person from diverse fields of knowledge. Besides that various extension lectures are also conducted from persons from diverse

disciplines of life like health and Medical education; Department of Forests, civil servants, research institutes, Lawyers, and university professors, etc.

The College has an Alumni Association namely 'Shaheen Club' which is existing from last two decades. The association stands registered with the Registrar of Societies. The Principal of the College is the ex-officio Patron of the association. The association usually held meetings wherein decisions regarding enhancing membership and collecting fees from members and members provide valuable suggestions for the betterment of academic and other activities of the College. The membership forms for the association have been made available on the College website..... for free and easy membership.

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

The annual publication of prospects before the commencement of the academic session provides updated information to the students regarding college profile, faculty, organizational structure, calendar of college activities, admission procedure to various courses of the college, fee structure, library services, NCC, NSS, sports activities, financial assistances and scholarships schemes, career counselling etc. The notifications are generally published in local dailies, besides college website and College face book page. The college website is updated on daily basis. In addition to it, information is also displayed on electronic boards.
