

## DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

### DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

#### 1. Botany Lab

The departmental lab is fully equipped with prerequisite freshly preserved class work material, specimen jars, Bio-visual charts, chemicals; double distillation units, CCTV fitted microscope; LCD Projector, Laptop, Binocular Research Microscope; BOD Chamber Hot air oven etc. The department being Wi-fi enabled has all ICT gadgets in place which augment educational ambiance. The electronic gadgets are backed by uninterrupted power supply.

#### 2. Botanical Garden

The college has a beautiful botanical garden having a diverse range of herbs, shrubs and ornamentals, both native and exotic. The green house in the botanical garden houses diverse succulents belonging to various genera and representatives of gymnosperms besides other indoor plants. It is fully equipped with continuous drip irrigation system. The Rosary and Shrubbery section of botanical garden contain spectrum of variants which add beauty to Botanical garden. Every efforts are being utilized to adopt organic farming method like use of wormicompos, peatmoss and cow dung, as substitute for chemical fertilizer. From the current session adequate irrigation facility has been installed in each garden.

#### 3. Rock Garden

From the current session the department has designed a Rock garden which is annexed to the botanical garden. The garden serves as a suitable habitat for xerophytes and medicinal plants which thrive under hardy conditions.



#### 4. Medicinal and Aromatic Plants (MAPs) Garden

Medicinal and Aromatic plants constitute a local heritage and a vital bio resource with worldwide importance. There are large number of Medicinal and Aromatic plant species in the world. Many of them we use for various purposes and many more are not known to us. This upcoming garden has been established on the foothills of hillock in the vicinity of staff quarters. Various medicinal and aromatic plants which have tremendous potential in pharmaceutical and cosmetic/perfumery industry have been planted. Efforts are being planned to augment this garden with diverse medicinal and ornamental flora which will serve as a research site as well as a demonstration site for students.



#### 5. Botany Museum

The Department has well maintained and a spacious plant museum which contains freshly preserved and labeled Plant specimen for use of students during lab course, Specimen jars for live demonstration to students. Besides, a well maintained and properly classified and identified herbarium adds to the grace of museum.



1. Celebration of World Arbour Day: The NSS units (Unit I, Unit II and Unit III) in collaboration with the department of Botany convened World Arbour Day on 30 March, 2015.
2. In continuation with the World Arbour Day, a massive plantation drive named as “**Mission 200**” was launched. The plantation drive was organized on 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2015 in collaboration with department of botany. The drive realized the target of planting 200 trees, by the Principal, HoD Botany, NSS Programme Officers and Staff (teaching and non-teaching).
3. The NSS units of the college also collaborated with the department of psychology to host a 5-Day National Workshop on “**Reshaping Youth Leadership for 21<sup>st</sup> Century; an Initiative for Youth-led Development**”, which was organized by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNID) regional office Chandigarh, in which around 50 participants took part. The participants learned various skills, pertaining to leadership, vision setting, goal setting, goal making, etc. Ms. Manjoola Salaria was the chief resource person for the workshop.
4. The NSS units of the college also led a contingent of NSS volunteers for a rescue program for the victims of fire at Mohalla Jalal Sahib Baramulla on 11<sup>th</sup> May, 2015. The team was accompanied by NSS programme Officers Dr. Satwant Singh (Unit I), Mr. Navshad Wani (Unit II) and Mtr. Rabia Rasool (Unit III) along with NSS Volunteers and NCC Cadets. Some relief material including school bags and stationary items were distributed among victims.

## NCC Activities-2015


